Not much to report this week but here are a few reminders that I've been asked to issue.

Brown Tail Moths: We're entering the period where it's important to keep lights out as much as possible, to prevent attraction of the moths.

Milfoil: A lot of floating milfoil has been found in the Long Beach Marina. Check your prop(s) to be sure you're not bringing it or spreading it. Please put any milfoil you pick up into the blue receptacle for that purpose. Also please don't deposit trash in the milfoil containers.

Dogs: This is turning into a regular reminder to please comply with our leash ordinance. In particular, pay attention to the hours and rules for dogs on beaches, and be considerate of other users.

Elections: Maine Primary Elections, as well as the annual MSAD-6 Election and Budget Validation Referendum will occur on June 9 at the Town Office. Absentee ballots can be requested until June 4, after June 4 you will have to have a special circumstance to request an absentee ballot. June 4 the Town Office will be open until 5:00 PM for absentee voting.

**TO REPORT A MEDICAL OR FIRE EMERGENCY
DIAL 9-1-1 and provide your street address**

From e bikes to leaf blowers, more and more electrical and electronic devices are powered by lithium batteries these days. So I'd like to mention some lithium battery safety tips.

- *Only buy and use products that are UL listed. Look for the UL symbol on the product.
- *Only use a charger made for your specific battery and always follow manufacturer's instructions
- *Do not charge below 32 degrees F or above 100 degrees F.

If you see any of these problem signs: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking or odd noises stop using or charging the battery immediately. If it is safe to do so move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call 9-1-1.

*Never put a lithium battery in the trash; take them to a recycling center.

This last point is very important. There have been a bunch of literal dumpster fires in the news lately that were caused by improper disposal of lithium batteries. If you throw your lithium battery in the regular trash and it gets crushed in the trash compactor at the transfer station it will catch fire, possibly explosively. If that were to happen we have installed a small capacity fire hose at the transfer station that can help contain any fire until the Fire Department can respond. But the best way to fight such a fire is to prevent it by disposing of batteries separately as hazardous waste.

If you come to the station, the EMT on duty may not be here.

We will begin blood pressure checks on Mondays and Wednesdays from 10 am to 11 am outside of the FI cafe in June. Stop by and say hello to your EMS folks!

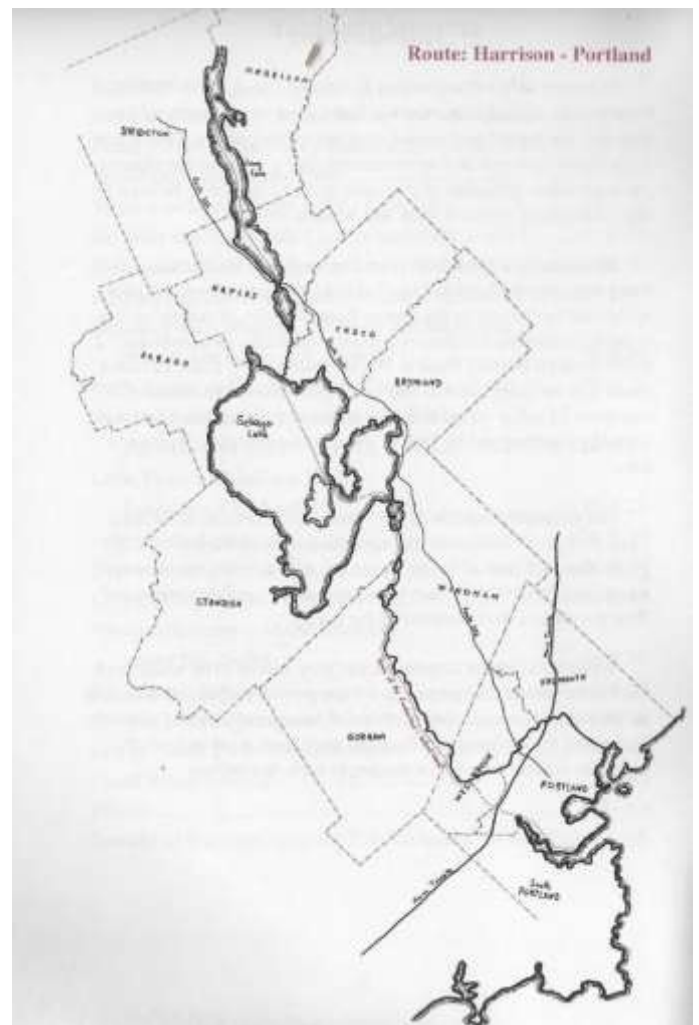


Frye Island Historical Society

[From a letter written in February of 1998 by Dr. Joseph Earnhardt, owner of the Frye's Leap Boys' Camp, to Peter Huchthausen, author of the book Frye Island, Maine's Newest Town, A History 1748-1998]

Part 4:

I should talk a bit about transportation on Sebago Lake in the 19th century in that Frye Island played a peripheral part. I think, about in the 1830s, transportation from Portland Harbor to the inland towns of Naples, Harrison and Bridgton came into demand. The Cumberland and Oxford Canal was built from Portland Harbor to Sebago Lake using a series of locks and ox-pulled barges. Rudiments of this canal are still visible in many places. If one takes Route 35 from North Windham toward Sebago Lake Station, he crosses a bridge soon after leaving North Windham. This bridge goes over the remains of the canal and carries the Presumpscot River for a way. If one looks, as he crosses the bridge, he will see the straight sides of the canal. The flatbottomed barges which were towed from Casco Bay entered Sebago Lake in the Basin. These barges had masts and once they were in the lake, they set their sails and traveled up via the Songo River with its one set of locks and on to Naples, Bridgton and Harrison. They carried general freight, passengers, amil, etc. At some time, they began to use steam engines for power. I mentioned that Frye Island was peripherally involved in that these freight boats, from time to time, sought shelter in the cove at the northeasterly end of the island – the property that I used to own. Years ago, in exploring the lake bottom of this cove, some of the children who spent their summers at the sailing camp which I operated found and recovered three large anchors which had belonged to some of these freight barges. I and my family spent the summer of 1949 camped on Frye Island. We slept in the cabin of one of these freight boats which had been abandoned on that beach. (to be continued...)
